

Mandy and Rick Grosvenor own and run a certified biodynamic (chemical free) fruit farm at Kangaroo Lake which is between Kerang and Swan Hill in north west Victoria. They have available a self-contained cabin that they would like to offer respite accommodation to Returned Service personnel who may need somewhere restful to recover for a variety of reasons.

The farm is 47 acres in size and being right beside the lake is a very peaceful place to be, with extensive walking tracks, and is a popular fishing spot.

The cabin measures approx. 8m x 5m; has its own bathroom, kitchen, queen size bed & soon to be installed 2 bunk beds, air conditioning, heating, and driveway. It's completely lockable, safe and private. It does have 2 steps (with handrails), but once inside is completely level.

Although people staying would be self-contained, Mandy and Rick are more than happy for them to pop inside for a coffee and some company when they need it, they also have a very friendly dog who would never say no to a walk if the person felt like company, and a couple of fenced paddocks if they just want to go and play with a ball or frisbee with him. There is also a large shed with lots of tools, and they are happy if people want to potter in there to avoid boredom.

There is no local public transport, but they are happy to assist with taking them to the supermarket or chemist as required.

Please note: November to March on some days during harvest time gas fired scatter guns are used to scare away birds in a non-lethal manner and that if hearing what sounds like gunfire would hinder your recovery, it may be better to come at a different time of year. They are not used every day, only when the bird population tries to consume the farm's income. They nickname them sharefarmers.

There is no cost to rent the cabin only a contribution of \$10 per week towards the electricity bill.

Federation President's Report

October 2019



The TPI Federation thanks the Members of Parliament, DVA Minister Chester MP, the Hon Ben Morton MP, Phillip Thompson OAM MP, and the Hon Andrew Wilkie MP and Senators, Jacqui Lambie, Eric Abetz, David Fawcett and Linda Reynolds CSC who gave of their valuable time to attend our recent National Congress and speak to, and listen to, our Directors.

Shayne Neumann MP was unavailable during the Congress but I have met with since the Congress and discussed the same issues with him as we did with the other politicians.

The National Congress's continue to grow in importance and value to all TPI/SRDs due, in the main, to the number of politicians, and the Department, who view it as highly valuable to sit at our table and express their views and also listen to each and every State/Territory Director and their individual issues. The TPI Federation is able to show to them a united front of a major Ex-Service Organisation (ESO) that it is, and how together we can progress issues, major and minor, for the betterment of all TPI/SRDs. United we stand I thank all Members for supporting your Directors in achieving and maintaining this objective.

The National Congress was very successful and we welcomed the two new Victorian Directors to the table. I hope they found it informative and productive. Each State and Territory Director will be providing you with their report on the Congress so I won't duplicate it here. Should you have any questions please contact your Director in the first instance or myself.

The Directors were able to discuss the frustration of all TPIs with regard to the long-awaited result of the Tune Review. You will recall the Prime Minister's election promise to review the TPI 'economic loss' Compensation. The Prime Minister did commence this review immediately upon being re-elected. The Terms of Reference for that review stated that the final report must be available as at 31st August. I am reliably informed that the report was on the Prime Minister's desk at 5pm on the 31st August. We have asked all the politicians that we spoke to at the National Congress to ask the Prime Minister to release that report and, hopefully, provide the nation's 28,000 TPI/SRDs of his decision on the review. It is now October and still we wait. Prime Minister you promised the review which you have done, but you did not promise to advise the result. We ask that you consider the needs of all TPI/SRDs and advise us of the result of this most important review.

The commencement of the contentious 12-Treatment Cycle requirements for DVA clients began on the 1st October. This means that Allied Health Providers, i.e. Occupational Therapists, Speech Therapists or Psychologists (TPIs have an exemption for Physiotherapy and Exercise Physiologists), must meet the new requirements. Therefore, after every 12 treatment sessions, or every 12 months (whichever happens first), the Allied Health Provider must write a report to the Veteran's GP. The GP then reviews that report and decides if a further referral should be extended to that provider or if a referral to a different provider should be made. This is not required for dental or optical providers. A number of ESOs have mounted campaigns to have this new requirement cancelled.

Should you have any issues regarding this new requirement, can you please let me know so that they can be addressed for you.

I take this opportunity to thank all those TPIs and TPI families who have contacted me over the last year and who have helped all TPIs with the many issues that have been put before DVA in the hope of obtaining a more wholesome and wellbeing life style for all of you. I wish every TPI and their family a happy Christmas and a Safe and Healthy New Year.

Finally, I revisit the hearing aid issue. The Veteran community seems to be slowly learning of their entitlements.

The hearing aid issue was mentioned to every politician who attended the national Congress. Senator Reynolds was able to say that she would investigate the issue. It was put to her that if the Defence personnel were able to obtain fully subsidised hearing aids for the ADF members then the Veteran community should also be able to utilise that system. The Senator's office has subsequently made an appointment in the coming weeks to discuss this.

Please pass this along to your Veteran and War Widow friends and families. They must know that they – NEVER, NEVER, EVER – pay for their hearing aids.

TREATMENT FOR CLINICAL CONDITIONS

Funding for pharmaceuticals and health services in the home

The [Repatriation Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme \(RPBS\)](#) provides eligible veterans, war widow(er)s, and their dependants access to a wide range of pharmaceuticals and dressings at a concessional rate. The RPBS also includes access to all items listed in the Schedule of Pharmaceutical Benefits available to the general community.

If you are a [Gold Card](#) or [White Card](#) holder living at home, you may also be eligible for a referral for health services such as [community nursing](#) and delivered through the [Veterans' Home Care \(VHC\) program](#). You may also be entitled to assistance through the [Rehabilitation Appliances Program \(RAP\)](#) to help you maintain functional independence in your home.

The [Coordinated Veterans' Care \(CVC\) Program](#) is available to [Gold Card](#) holders who are living at home and are at risk of being admitted to hospital due to congestive heart failure, coronary artery disease, pneumonia, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, diabetes or as a result of other complex care needs.

It is important to note that restrictions may apply to some services. You can find more about the [DVA funded health services available to you and their associated restrictions](#).

What type of health services are not funded by DVA?

DVA does **not** fund [alternative therapies](#) which include:

- acupuncture and acupressure*
- aromatherapy
- art therapy
- equine therapy
- homeopathy
- hypnotherapy and hypnosis
- massage or therapeutic touch*
- meditation
- music therapy
- reflexology and relation therapy
- reiki
- tai chi
- yoga

*Note: Massage services **may** be funded when provided by a Medicare Australia registered physiotherapist, chiropractor or osteopath as part of a treatment plan (upon referral by a GP). Acupuncture can only be funded when delivered by a GP registered with Medicare Australia to deliver that service.



VETERAN EXERCISE PROGRAMME



Managed and supervised by Accredited Exercise Physiologist Evangeline Lawrie (AEP) at Bibra Lake. Group sessions on Monday, Wednesday and Friday individually tailored dependent on conditions and fitness levels. Exercise Physiologists are university educated exercise professionals. Eve who runs this specialised program for Veterans understanding chronic musculoskeletal, neurological, mental health, cardiometabolic and cancer related conditions. 



HIGH TEMP in the PACIFIC

THE C-27J Spartan maintenance team for Operation Solania has returned from the high-tempo deployment, where they worked in support of the Pacific Island Forum Fisheries Agency's largest annual maritime surveillance operation.

The aircraft and avionics technicians generated serviceable aircraft for sorties, as well as embarking in the Spartan aircraft to assist the crew observing vessels at sea.

Avionics Technician CPL Mitchell Cocks said he enjoyed being part of the ADF mission.

"I have enjoyed the missions I have been a part of so far; the change in roles is definitely rewarding when you spot a boat on the horizon," CPL Cocks said. "Joining the crew for maritime flights was a huge change in responsibilities compared to my regular role as a maintainer.

"It has also been great to visit new places in the Pacific – I love travelling, so for me it was a great opportunity to experience other cultures and adventure in remote localities.

"There is rich history in the region, particularly from the Second World War."

Warrant Officer Engineering No. 35 Squadron WOFF Mark Taylor was responsible for the safety and wellbeing of personnel and ensured there was a maintenance capability.

"For Solania, our team consisted of both avionics and aircraft technicians supporting daily Spartan flights in the maritime environment," WOFF Taylor said.

"Solania had its own unique challenges due to the isolated nature of the areas of operation where equipment and support services were limited.

"Teams often travelled to locations where communication to home could be difficult, so we embarked an autonomous crew who could maintain the aircraft while deployed, independent of the maintenance support available in Australia."

The maintenance team achieved a 100 per cent mission success rate for Solania, with all sorties being conducted on time and as planned.

THE ANZAC on the WALL

I wandered thru a country town 'cos I had time to spare,
and went into an antique shop to see what was in there.
Old Bikes and pumps and kero lamps, but hidden by it all,
a photo of a soldier boy - an ANZAC, on the wall.

"The ANZAC have a name?" I asked. The old man answered "No."
"The ones who could have told me mate, have passed on long ago."

The old man kept on talking and according to his tale,
the photo was unwanted junk bought from a clearance sale.

"I asked around," the old man said, "but no one knows his face,
he's been on that wall twenty years, deserves a better place,
for someone must have loved him, so it seems a shame somehow."
I nodded in agreement and then said, "I'll take him now."

My nameless digger's photo - well it was a sorry sight,
a cracked glass pane and a broken frame, I just had to make it right.
I prised the photo from its frame and I took care, just in case,
'cause only sticky paper held the cardboard back in place.

I peeled away the faded screed and much to my surprise,
two letters and a telegram appeared before my eyes.
The first reveals my ANZAC's name, and regiment, of course,
John Mathew Francis Stuart - of Australia's own Light Horse.

This letter was written from the "Front," my interest now was keen,
the note was dated August seventh, 1917.

"Dear Mum, I'm at Khalasa Springs, not far from the Red Sea
they say it's in the Bible - looks like a Billabong to me."

"My Kathy wrote I'm in her prayers - she's still my Bride to be,
I just can't wait to see you both, you're all the world to me,
and Mum, you'll soon meet "Bluey." Last month they shipped him out, I told him
to call on you, when he's up and about."

"That "Bluey is a larrikin and we all thought it funny
when he lobbed a Turkish hand grenade into the C.O's dunny.
I told you how he dragged me, wounded in from no man's land,
he stopped the bleeding - closed the wound, with only his bare hand?"

"Then he copped it at the Front, from some stray shrapnel blast,
it was my turn to drag him in and I thought he wouldn't last.
He woke up in hospital and nearly lost his mind
'cause out there on the battlefield he'd left one leg behind."

He'd been in a bad way Mum, he knows he'll ride no more.
Like me, he loves a horse's back, he was a champ before.
So please Mum, can you take him in, he's been like my brother,
he was raised in a Queensland Orphanage - he's never known a mother."

"But strewth, I miss Australia Mum, and in my mind each day,
I'm a mountain cattleman on the high plains far away,
I'm mustering white-faced cattle with no camel's hump in sight
and I waltz my matilda by a campfire every night."

I wonder who rides "Billy, I heard the pub burnt down,
I'll always love you and please say hooroo to all in town."
The second letter I could see was in the lady's hand,
an answer to her soldier son there in a foreign land.

Her copperplate was perfect, the pages neat and clean,
it bore the date November third, 1917.
"It was hard enough to lose your Dad, without you at the war,
I'd hoped you would be home by now - each day I miss you more."

"Your Kathy calls around a lot since you have been away,
to share with me her hopes and dreams about your wedding day.
And "Bluey" has arrived - and what a Godsend he has been,
we've talked and laughed for days about the things you've done and seen."

"He really is a comfort and works hard around the farm,
I read the same hope in his eyes that you won't come to harm.
McConnell's kids rode "Billy" but then, suddenly a change,
we had a violent lightening storm and it was really strange."

"Last Wednesday, just on midnight, not a single cloud in sight,
it raged for several minutes, it gave us all a fright.
It really spooked your "Billy" - he screamed and bucked and reared
and then he rushed the slip-rail fence, which by a foot he cleared."

"They brought him back next afternoon but something's changed, I fear,
it's like the day you brought him home, for no one can get near.
Remember when you caught him with his black and flowing mane?
Now, horse breakers fear the beast that only you can tame."

"That's why we need you home son" - then the flow of ink went dry,
this letter was unfinished and I couldn't work out why
until I started reading letter number three,
a yellowed telegram delivered news of tragedy.

Her son, killed in action - oh - what a pain that must have been,
the same date as her letter - November third, 1917.
This letter, which was never sent, became then one of three
she sealed behind the photo's face - the face she longed to see.

And John's home-town's old timers - children when he went to war,
would say no greater cattleman had left the town before.
They knew his widowed mother well - and with respect did tell
how, when she lost her only boy - she lost her mind as well.

She could not face the awful truth, to strangers she would speak,
"My Johnny's at the war, you know, he's coming home next week."
They all remembered "Bluey", he stayed on to the end,
the younger man with a wooden leg became her closest friend.

And he would go and find her when she wandered, old and weak,
and always softly say - "Yes dear - John will be home next week."
Then when she died "Bluey" moved on, to Queensland some did say,
I tried to find out where he went but don't know to this day.

And Kathy never wed - a lonely spinster some found odd,
she wouldn't set foot in a church - she'd turned her back on God.
John's mother left no will, I learned on my detective trail.
This explained my photo's journey - that clearance sale.

But I continued digging 'cause I wanted to know more.
I found John's name, with thousands, in the records of that war.
His last ride proved his courage - a ride you will acclaim,
The Light Horse Charge at Beersheba, of everlasting fame.

That last day in October, back in 1917
at 4pm, our brave boys fell - that sad fact I did glean.
That's when John's life was sacrificed, the record's crystal clear,
but 4pm in Beersheba is midnight over here.....

So as John's gallant spirit rose to cross the great divide,
were lightening bolts back home a signal from the other side?
Is that why "Billy" bolted and went racing as in pain,
because he'd never feel his master on his back again?

Was it coincidental? Same time, same day, same date?
Some proof of numerology, or just a quirk of fate?
I think it's more that you know, as I've heard wiser men
acknowledge there are many things that go beyond our ken.

Where craggy peaks guard secrets 'neath dark skies torn asunder,
where hoof beats are companions to the rolling waves of thunder,
where lightening cracks like 303's and ricochets again,
where howling moaning gusts of wind sound just like dying men.

Some mountain cattlemen have sworn, on lonely alpine track,
they've glimpsed a huge, black stallion - Light Horseman on his back.
Yes, sceptics say, it's swirling clouds just forming apparitions.
Oh no, my friend, you can't dismiss all this as simply superstition.

The desert of Beersheba - or windswept Aussie range,
John Stuart rides forever there, No, I don't find that strange.
Now, some gaze at this photo and they often question me,
and I tell them a small, white lie and say - he's family.
"You must be proud of him," they say - I tell them one and all,
that's why he takes the pride of place - my ANZAC on the wall.

AIR Force gave two Palauans a bird's-eye view during an important anti-illegal fishing operation as part of Operation Solania.

Air Force personnel flying the C-27J Spartan on Solania were joined during a maritime sortie by Fisheries Scientist for the Ministry of Natural Resources, Environment and Tourism, Vanessa Jaiteh, and Officer Carter Yamaguchi of the Division of Marine Law Enforcement – Palau.

They flew in the Spartan for a six-hour mission off the coast of the Republic of Palau.

Mrs Jaiteh said it was great to experience the ADF involvement through Operation Solania and the Pacific Islands' Operation Kuru Kuru.

"Illegal and unregulated fishing robs Palau and other coastal states of their resources and income that they could be making," she said.

"One of the biggest issues in Palau is that we don't have the capacity to enforce law in our exclusive economic zone by ourselves.

"The ADF presence has definitely assisted us to do this.

"The flying itself was amazing – it was interesting to be able to observe vessels at sea."

Air Force Task Element Commander FLTLT David Holmes said working with local authorities was an important aspect of Solania.

"The latest iteration of Solania has supported a targeted effort to detect and deter illegal and unregulated fishing in the South Pacific," FLTLT Holmes said.

"We've been working in our Pacific partners' backyards and it is with the support of local agencies and authorities that we could work to achieve the mission."

The *Palau National Marine Sanctuary Act* was signed in 2015 and seeks to protect more than 80 per cent of Palau's exclusive economic zone; the remaining 20 per cent is reserved for traditional fishing and highly regulated domestic fishing.

Operation Solania was the ADF contribution to maritime surveillance within the Pacific Region in partnership with Pacific Island nations.

The latest iteration supported Operation Kuru Kuru, which is the Pacific Island Forum Fishing Agency's largest annual maritime surveillance operation.

YOUR WILL

Marriage of Testator / Testatrix

If you marry after you have made a Will, your marriage will have the effect of cancelling your Will unless

- a special section has been put in it, or
- for the will of a person who dies on or after 9 February 2008, there is other evidence to show the Will was made when you were contemplating marriage.

This could result in a legal argument over your estate that could end up in the courts.

If, when you make your Will, you are about to get married, you should include a statement that says you wrote your Will "in contemplation of marriage", and you should name the person you intend to marry. If you then marry that person, your Will is not cancelled.

People who have married after making their Will should get advice from a lawyer to find out if the Will is valid and should consider making a new Will to include the changed situation.

Divorce of testator / testatrix

If you get divorced or your marriage is annulled on or after 9 February 2008 your Will is cancelled unless

- a contrary intention is expressed in your Will or
- there is other evidence showing this intention.

So if you do not want your Will cancelled when you get divorced you should state this in your Will. If you then get divorced your Will is not revoked.

If you were divorced before 9 February 2008 your Will is not cancelled when you divorce. You may want to consider making a new will to include the new situation.






Google 'Retirement Planning' and you will find dozens of sites suggesting ways to financially prepare for your post-employment decades, but few providing a framework for social planning.

Time with the children/grandchildren is often the notion, but they too move on. A British study determined that strong social networks led to more satisfying retirement than having children or grandchildren around. Those in a long-term relationship were also more satisfied than single retirees. The message for retirement planning? For most people, ensuring community participation is important in lieu of work, and it is probably a good idea to involve your partner in your planning to ensure s/he is happy to have you around!

Social planning for retirement mirrors financial planning: Set and prioritise goals, determine a path to get there, minimise risks and maximise returns. Some will have more control over their decisions than others, but a satisfying retirement won't just 'happen'. Consider:

What is your perception of retirement? If it is simply to sit on the couch watching TV, it is likely to be a shorter retirement. Or more likely, do you see an opportunity?

Are there aspects of work that you will miss, including income? Do you want to retire abruptly, or transition gradually through part-time, job-share or casual work? You may not have (or want) to give up all contact. Is there a social group at work (or alumni) to maintain relationships? Until you have a clear plan of how you will spend your time, it can be difficult to determine what your financial needs will be.

Who is the 'new' you, and what do you want to be (like when you left school, but with decades of wisdom to guide)? What attributes, experiences and strengths do you have? Write them down. Identify your weaknesses honestly and how you might address them or minimise their impact.

Set your goals in realistic and achievable terms, but don't be afraid to extend yourself and take a risk. Will you be very different socially? Has the inner musician, student, artist, walker, traveller, actor, genealogist, gardener, entrepreneur, business owner or volunteer been trapped in the workplace? Plan ahead if you can envision this and structure your transition to maximise the chance of success.

Will you miss the structure of the working day? If yes, maintain a clear routine, and even a 'working' week. If not, enjoy the flexibility and consider how you will achieve your goals with a little less certainty. You may have an extra 50 hours available each week - use them well.

Many retirees 'downsize' or opt for a sea/tree change. There are social losses that occur with such a decision, as friends and neighbours are further away. Some find value in renting and/or joining social groups in their chosen area ahead of the move in order to better inform their decision.

The MHPE messages of physical activity, sound nutrition, social engagement and mental stimulation become even more important.

What does your spouse/partner think about your retirement plans? Will you get underfoot or complement each other? This is the most important discussion of all.

If you choose to pass on something to the children following such planning, regardless of the inheritance, it will be a happy, stimulated and engaged retiree who the grandchildren will always remember as someone they wanted to be with.

Please Note:

Under the Act a person is excluded from being on the Committee without special approval from the Commissioner for Consumer Protection if they:

- 1) are bankrupt or their affairs are under insolvency laws;
- 2) have been convicted of an indictable offence in relation to the formation or management of a body corporate in the last five years;
- 3) have been convicted of an offence involving fraud or dishonesty punishable by at least three months imprisonment in the last five years; or
- 4) have been convicted of an offence under section 127 of the Act, where a person has allowed an association to operate while insolvent in the last five years.




